**APPOINTMENT OF A QUALIFIED SERVICE PROVIDER TO SUPPLY AND INSTALL  
ADDITIONAL SECURITY EQUIPMENT AT THE NEDLAC BUILDING**

**1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 The National Economic Development and Labour Council (Nedlac) is a statutory body that was established through Nedlac Act No. 35 of 1994 and operates under the terms of its own Nedlac Constitution. Nedlac's vision is to promote growth, equity and participation through social dialogue.

**2. PURPOSE**

2.1 Nedlac requires services of a reputable and experienced service provider with expertise in the installation of building security equipment, to install an electric fence and additional CCTV cameras and related equipment.

2.2 The objective of this exercise is to ensure reasonable security and prevention of potential risk of unauthorised and unmonitored entry via the east side of the Nedlac parameter wall, including the installation of additional CCTV cameras and related equipment to all blind spot areas around the Nedlac premises.

**3. BACKGROUND**

3.1 Nedlac has one office nationally with an employee compliment of +-50 and external stakeholders/social partners. Before the Covid19 pandemic, on average +- sixty people would use the facilities on a daily basis. The office is situated at 14A Jellicoe Avenue in Rosebank, Johannesburg.

#### 4. SCOPE OF WORK

4.1 Nedlac requires services of a reputable and experienced building security equipment supplier and installer to perform the following:

- a) Supply and erect an electric fence on the parameter wall that is located on east side of the Nedlac building’;
- b) Assess all the potential blind spot and risky areas of the premises that require additional CCTV cameras;
- c) Supply and install CCTV cameras and required monitor/s;
- d) Integrate the current security equipment and CCTV camera system with the new installations;
- e) Ensure to supply and use SABS approved equipment and wiring;
- f) Ensure that the installations are in line with required safety practices compliant to the installation of such equipment.
