- (c) **“bid”** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (d) **“Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act”** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

**1. INTRODUCTION**

The Presidential Climate Commission (PCC) is a multi-stakeholder body established in 2020 by the President of South Africa to advise on the country's climate change response and support a just transition to a low-carbon climate-resilient economy and society. The commission comprises of government ministers and 22 commissioners that represent diverse perspectives of social partners, including academia, business, civil society, labour, and youth. The Commission emanates from the Presidential Summit held in October 2018, when social partners agreed that a statutory entity should be formed to coordinate and oversee the just transition towards a low-carbon, inclusive, climate-resilient economy, and society.

The PCC is currently hosted at the National Economic Development and Labour Council (NEDLAC), owing to its legal establishment processes currently underway. Nedlac requires a suitably qualified, experienced service provider to provide the Presidential Climate Commission with various branded stationery and marketing collateral.

**2. BACKGROUND**

The PCC secretariate are running a series of events to engage with various stakeholders on South Africa's Just Transition. The PCC conducts its work in an open and transparent manner with the aim of building social consensus around the complex and challenging decisions required to successfully navigate the climate transition. The

PCC's mandate emanates from the Presidential Jobs Summit held in 2018, and the PCC is committed to ensuring that the transition is socially just and that the needs of vulnerable groups are addressed.

In fulfilling its mandate, the PCC conducts consultations in with various stakeholder groups in South Africa. These events and publications are publicised on the PCC website [www.climatecommission.org.za](http://www.climatecommission.org.za) and PCC social media. The PCC requires the services of a suitably qualified and experienced service provider to provide live streaming services across its digital platforms.

### **3. SCOPE OF WORK**

The PCC seeks a service provider who will provide the following services

#### **3.1. Audio/Visual Equipment**

- 3.1.1. Provide videography services for consultation – two cameras compatible with livestreaming and analogue sound system
- 3.1.2. Provision of a full sound package – compatible with analogue system
- 3.1.3. 2 roving microphones
- 3.1.4. 1 clicker

#### **3.2. Livestreaming from Zoom to the following PCC platforms:**

- 3.2.1. PCC Website
- 3.2.2. Facebook
- 3.2.3. YouTube
- 3.2.4. Projection of Zoom Room
- 3.2.5. Recording of stream

- 3.4. The professional service provider will be required to work closely with the PCC’s Communications team on all consultations.
- 3.5. The service provider is expected to be available for testing sessions/dry runs **two (2) hours prior to consultations. Each consultation will run for a period of three (3) hours.**
- 3.6. The appointed service provider will engage in a PCC organised **inception meeting**, with a view to agree on project details.
